

"Boy Evangelist" Will Preach At Mt. Zion Church



Ralph Leroy Miller, fourteen year old "boy evangelist of Michigan" will preach two sermons tomorrow at Mt. Zion Christian Church in the Greencastle neighborhood of the county.

The youthful minister is a son of Charles E. and Hester Morgan Miller, both former residents of Warren county, and was born in this county. He is a great-grandson of Levi B. Morgan, who was a noted preacher of the Church of Christ in his day.

Having just completed his high school course at Marysville, Michigan, the youth is now preparing to enter college next fall. He is in the South visiting the three schools he is considering, David Lipscomb at Nashville, Freed-Hardeman at Henderson, Tennessee, or Harding College at Morrilton, Arkansas.

One of the sermons tomorrow will be at 11 a. m. and the other will be at 3 p. m. A basket dinner will be served on the church grounds.

Immediately after the afternoon service, the young man will leave for Nashville.

Despite his youth he has been preaching for three years, having held services in 21 different cities and villages in Michigan and Canada. Graduating from high school this year he was the third member his class although he completed the four year course in three years.

He has won several oratorical contests.
